She made many friends and became a Guadalupana, serving meals on Sundays mornings after mass at St. Joseph's Church. A fall 6 years back slowed her down, but didn't stop her. She insisted on doing her own chores, cleaning, laundry (every Wednesday) cooking, for many years she resisted Home Providers, "I can do it" " why should I pay them when I can do it". It was her grit. She loved a McDonalds 1/4 pounder with fries. Most any other food was good, but that was her favorite. We shared lunch together a few times a week. Whenever I entered her Apt. her first words were "what did you bring me." I will miss those lunches. Even at age 92, her mental state was upbeat.
