Ann Montgomery, age 86, peacefully passed away on Tuesday, February 4, 2025, surrounded by family in San Antonio, Texas. She was born on September 12, 1938, in Paint Rock, Texas, and was raised on a ranch in Ozona alongside her brother.

In 1957, Ann met the love of her life, Clarence Rondal “Ronnie” Montgomery. They married on March 9, 1957, in a Methodist chapel in Amarillo, Texas, beginning a life filled with adventure, resilience, and deep devotion. Only Ronnie could call her “Tillie,” a testament to their special bond.

Together, they built a life that spanned military service and business ownership. In 1964, they made Del Rio, Texas, their home and raised two children, Rhonda and Wade. Over the years, they established multiple successful businesses, including Ronnie Montgomery Painting, Ronnie Montgomery Plumbing, and Ronnie Montgomery Construction. Later, Ann became the broker of Ann Montgomery Real Estate, paving the way for a family legacy in the industry.

At just 44, Ann retired and embraced a life of travel, golf, fishing, and hunting with Ronnie. Golf quickly became her greatest passion, and the two competed in couples tournaments, creating cherished memories on the course. After Ronnie’s passing on October 10, 1997, Ann found solace in the game, playing

nearly every day.

Her entrepreneurial spirit and love for real estate inspired her daughter, Rhonda, to open Rhonda Montgomery Real Estate and later RE/MAX Del Rio. Her son, Wade, followed in his father's footsteps, founding Wade Montgomery Construction, specializing in custom homes.

Ann was preceded in death by her beloved husband of 46 years, Ronnie Montgomery, and her parents, Amanda Caroline and Robert Hammonds Sparks.

She leaves behind her daughter, Rhonda Sue Montgomery of Del Rio; her son, Wade Ray Montgomery and wife Renee Montgomery of Del Rio; and her brother, Gordon Sparks and wife None Sparks of San Angelo. Ann is also survived by many cousins, close relatives, and dear friends.

In her Bible, Ann had written these words about her marriage:
