



## Capt. Roberto P. Mauricio, USMC (Ret.)

June 29, 1934 - March 24, 2015

Capt. Roberto Pedro Mauricio, USMC (Retired), age 80, peacefully passed away Tuesday, March 24, 2015 at Downtown Baptist Medical Center in San Antonio, Texas. He was born June 29, 1934 in Bexar, Texas.

Roberto is a combat decorated veteran who served in the Korean and Vietnam Wars as a Captain in the United States Marine Corps. He is a recipient of the Presidential Unit Citation, Vietnam Campaign Medal and the RVN Cross of Gallantry.
