



Ted Isom Lewis

March 26, 1922 - January 24, 2014

Ted Isom Lewis passed away Friday, January 24, 2014, at his residence in Del Rio at the age of 91. He was born March 26, 1922, in Ozark, Arkansas.

He was preceded in death by two sons: John Lewis, who died at a young age and Charles Lewis, who died as a result of Agent Orange poisoning he was exposed to during the Vietnam War.

Ted joined the United States Army on June 25, 1940, and retired with Honors after 21 years of active duty service at the rank of Master Sergeant. He saw combat in WWII, Korea, and other hot conflicts around the world; Ted served his country in the most heroic ways. He earned the Bronze Star and Purple Heart while involved with MARS Task Force invasion of Burma, known as the 200-mile march. This battle was considered one of the most important victories for the Allies that led to the defeat of the Japanese.

Ted taught college ROTC at the University of Idaho in Pocatello. Finally retiring from the Army, Ted traveled the country and Mexico before settling in Del Rio, Texas, for the past 20+ years.

Ted is survived and truly missed by his only daughter, Mary, and by his son, Val, and their families, including his seven grandchildren, and The United States of America; truly a war hero!

Graveside services are scheduled for Monday, February 3, 2014, at 9:15 AM at Ft. Sam Houston National Cemetery in San Antonio, Texas, with full Military Honors conducted by the U.S. Army.
